

THE FIRST BOOK OF MOSES CALLED
GENESIS

1 In the ^abeginning ^bGod created the heaven and the earth.

²And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness *was* upon the face of the deep. ^cAnd the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

^{3d}And God said, ^eLet there be light: and there was light.

⁴And God saw the light, that *it was* good: and God divided the light from the darkness.

⁵And God called the light ^fDay, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

⁶And God said, ^gLet there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.

⁷And God made the firmament, ^hand divided the waters which *were* under the firmament from the waters which *were* ⁱabove the firmament: and it was so.

⁸And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day.

⁹And God said, ^jLet the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry *land* appear: and it was so.

¹⁰And God called the dry *land* Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas: and God saw that *it was* good.

¹¹And God said, Let the earth ^kbring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, *and* the ^lfruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed *is* in itself, upon the earth: and it was so.

¹²And the earth brought forth grass, *and* herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed *was* in itself, after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

¹³And the evening and the morning were the third day.

¹⁴And God said, Let there be ^mlights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and ⁿfor seasons, and for days, and years:

¹⁵And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so.

¹⁶And God ^omade two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and ^pthe lesser light to rule the night: *he made* ^qthe stars also.

¹⁷And God set them in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth,

¹⁸And to ^rrule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness: and God saw that *it was* good.

¹⁹And the evening and the morning were the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl *that* may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven.

²¹And ^sGod created great whales, and every living creature that moveth, which the waters brought forth abundantly, after their kind, and every winged fowl after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

²²And God blessed them, saying, ^tBe fruitful, and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let fowl multiply in the earth.

²³And the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

²⁴And God said, Let the earth bring forth the living creature after his kind, cattle, and creeping thing, and beast of the earth after his kind: and it was so.

²⁵And God made the beast of the earth after his kind, and cattle after their kind, and every thing that creepeth upon the earth after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.

²⁶And God said, ^uLet us make man in our image, after our likeness: and ^vlet them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

²⁷So God created man in his *own* image, ^win the image of God created he him; ^xmale and female created he them.

28 And God blessed them, and God said unto them, ^aBe fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

29 And God said, Behold, I have given you every herb bearing seed, which *is* upon the face of all the earth, and every tree, in the which *is* the fruit of a tree yielding seed; ^bto you it shall be for meat.

30 And to ^cevery beast of the earth, and to every ^dfowl of the air, and to every thing that creepeth upon the earth, wherein *there is* life, *I have given* every green herb for meat: and it was so.

31 ^eAnd God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, *it was* very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

2 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and ^fall the host of them.

2^g And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.

3 And God ^hblessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which God created and made.

4 ⁱThese *are* the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens,

5 And every ^jplant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not ^kcaused it to rain upon the earth, and *there was* not a man ^lto till the ground.

6 But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

7 And the LORD God formed man of the ^mdust of the ground, and ⁿbreathed into his ^onostrils the breath of life; and ^pman became a living soul.

8 And the LORD God planted ^qa garden ^reastward in ^sEden; and there ^the put the man whom he had formed.

9 And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow ^uevery tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; ^vthe tree of life also in the midst

of the garden, ^wand the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

10 And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads.

11 The name of the first *is* ^xPison: that *is* it which compasseth ^ythe whole land of Havilah, where *there is* gold;

12 And the gold of that land *is* good: ^zthere *is* bdellium and the onyx stone.

13 And the name of the second river *is* Gihon: the same *is* it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia.

14 And the name of the third river *is* ^{aa}Hiddekel: that *is* it which goeth toward the east of Assyria. And the fourth river *is* Euphrates.

15 And the LORD God took the man, and ^{ab}put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it.

16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat:

17 ^{ab}But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, ^{ac}thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof ^{ad}thou shalt surely die.

18 And the LORD God said, *It is* not good that the man should be alone; ^{ae}I will make him an help meet for him.

19 ^{af}And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and ^{ag}brought *them* unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that *was* the name thereof.

20 And Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.

21 And the LORD God caused a ^{ah}deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;

22 And the rib, which the LORD God had taken from man, made he a woman, and ^{ai}brought her unto the man.

23 And Adam said, This *is* now ^{aj}bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was ^{ak}taken out of Man.

24 ^{al}Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall

cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

²⁵ *a* And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not *b* ashamed.

3 Now the *c*serpent was *d*more *e*subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?

² And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the trees of the garden:

³ *e* But of the fruit of the tree which *f*s in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die.

⁴ *f* And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die:

⁵ For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then *g*your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.

⁶ And when the woman saw that the tree *was* good for food, and that it *was* pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make *one* wise, she took of the fruit thereof, *h*and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; *and* he did eat.

⁷ And *i*the eyes of them both were opened, *h*and they knew that they *were* naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons.

⁸ And they heard *l*the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife *m*hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden.

⁹ And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where *art* thou?

¹⁰ And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, *n*and I was afraid, because I *was* naked; and I hid myself.

¹¹ And he said, Who told thee that thou *wast* naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldst not eat?

¹² And the man said, *o*The woman whom thou gavest to *be* with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.

¹³ And the LORD God said unto the woman, What *is* this *that* thou hast done? And the woman said, *p*The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat.

¹⁴ And the LORD God said *q*unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou *art* cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and *d*ust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life:

¹⁵ And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between *s*thy seed and *t*her seed; *u*it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

¹⁶ Unto the woman he said, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; *v*in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; *w*and thy desire *shall be* to thy husband, and he shall *x*rule over thee.

¹⁷ And unto Adam he said, *y*Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, *z*and hast eaten of the tree, *aa*of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: *ab*cursed *is* the ground for thy sake; *ac*in sorrow shalt thou eat *of* it all the days of thy life;

¹⁸ *ad*Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and *ae*thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

¹⁹ *af*In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: *ag*for dust thou *art*, and *ah*unto dust shalt thou return.

²⁰ And Adam called his wife's name *Eve*; because she was the mother of all living.

²¹ Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.

²² And the LORD God said, *ai*Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and *aj*take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever:

²³ Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, *ak*to till the ground from whence he was taken.

²⁴ So he drove out the man; and he placed *al*at the east of the garden of Eden *am*Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of the tree of life.

4 And Adam knew *Eve* his wife; and she conceived, and bare Cain, and said, I have gotten a man from the LORD.

²And she again bare his brother Abel. And Abel was a keeper of sheep, but Cain was ^aa tiller of the ground.

³And in process of time it came to pass, that Cain brought ^bof the fruit of the ground an offering unto the LORD.

⁴And Abel, he also brought of ^cthe firstlings of his flock and of the fat thereof. And the LORD had ^drespect unto Abel and to his offering:

⁵But unto Cain and to his offering he had not respect. And Cain was very wroth, ^eand his countenance fell.

⁶And the LORD said unto Cain, Why art thou wroth? and why is thy countenance fallen?

⁷If thou doest well, shalt thou not be accepted? and if thou doest not well, sin lieth at the door. And unto thee *shall be* his desire, and thou shalt rule over him.

⁸And Cain talked with Abel his brother: and it came to pass, when they were in the field, that Cain rose up against Abel his brother, and ^fslew him.

⁹And the LORD said unto Cain, ^gWhere *is* Abel thy brother? And he said, ^hI know not: *Am* I my brother's keeper?

¹⁰And he said, What hast thou done? the voice of thy brother's blood ⁱcrieth unto me from the ground.

¹¹And now *art* thou cursed from the earth, which hath opened her mouth to receive thy brother's blood from thy hand;

¹²When thou tillest the ground, it shall not henceforth yield unto thee her strength; a fugitive and a vagabond shalt thou be in the earth.

¹³And Cain said unto the LORD, My punishment *is* greater than I can bear.

¹⁴Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and ^kfrom thy face shall I be hid; and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and it shall come to pass, ^lthat every one that findeth me shall slay me.

¹⁵And the LORD said unto him, Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him ^msevenfold. And the LORD ⁿset a mark upon Cain, lest any finding him should kill him.

¹⁶And Cain ^owent out from the presence of the LORD, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden.

¹⁷And Cain knew his wife; and she conceived, and bare Enoch; and he builded a city, ^pand called the name of the city, after the name of his son, Enoch.

¹⁸And unto Enoch was born Irad: and Irad begat Mehujael: and Mehujael begat Methusael: and Methusael begat Lamech.

¹⁹And Lamech took unto him two wives: the name of the one *was* Adah, and the name of the other Zillah.

²⁰And Adah bare Jabal: he was the father of such as dwell in tents, and *of such as have* cattle.

²¹And his brother's name *was* Jubal: he was the ^qfather of all such as handle the harp and organ.

²²And Zillah, she also bare Tubal-cain, an instructor of every artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tubal-cain *was* Naamah.

²³And Lamech said unto his wives, Adah and Zillah, Hear my voice; ye wives of Lamech, hearken unto my speech: for I have slain a man to my wounding, and a young man to my hurt.

²⁴If Cain shall be avenged sevenfold, truly Lamech seventy and sevenfold.

²⁵And Adam knew his wife again; and she bare a son, and ^scalled his name Seth: For God, *said she*, hath appointed me another seed instead of Abel, whom Cain slew.

²⁶And to Seth, ^tto him also there was born a son; and he called his name Enos: then began men ^uto call upon the name of the LORD.

5 This *is* the ^vbook of the generations of Adam. In the day that God created man, in ^wthe likeness of God made he him;

^{2x}Male and female created he them; and blessed them, and called their name Adam, in the day when they were created.

³And Adam lived an hundred and thirty years, and begat *a son* in his own likeness, after his image; and ^ycalled his name Seth:

⁷And Seth lived after he begat Enos eight hundred and seven years, and begat sons and daughters:

⁸And all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years: and he died.

⁹And Enos lived ninety years, and begat Cainan:

¹⁰And Enos lived after he begat Cainan eight hundred and fifteen years, and begat sons and daughters:

¹¹And all the days of Enos were nine hundred and five years: and he died.

¹²And Cainan lived seventy years, and begat Mahalaleel:

¹³And Cainan lived after he begat Mahalaleel eight hundred and forty years, and begat sons and daughters:

¹⁴And all the days of Cainan were nine hundred and ten years: and he died.

¹⁵And Mahalaleel lived sixty and five years, and begat Jared:

¹⁶And Mahalaleel lived after he begat Jared eight hundred and thirty years, and begat sons and daughters:

¹⁷And all the days of Mahalaleel were eight hundred ninety and five years: and he died.

¹⁸And Jared lived an hundred sixty and two years, and he begat ^cEnoch:

¹⁹And Jared lived after he begat Enoch eight hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:

²⁰And all the days of Jared were nine hundred sixty and two years: and he died.

²¹And Enoch lived sixty and five years, and begat Methuselah:

²²And Enoch ^dwalked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years, and begat sons and daughters:

²³And all the days of Enoch were three hundred sixty and five years:

²⁴And ^eEnoch walked with God: and he *was* not; for God took him.

²⁵And Methuselah lived an hundred eighty and seven years, and begat Lamech:

²⁶And Methuselah lived after he begat Lamech seven hundred eighty and two years, and begat sons and daughters:

²⁷And all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred sixty and nine years: and he died.

²⁸And Lamech lived an hundred eighty and two years, and begat a son:

²⁸ And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin:

²⁹ And yet I say unto you, That even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.

³⁰ Wherefore, if God so clothe the grass of the field, which to day is, and to morrow is cast into the oven, *shall he* not much more *clothe* you, O ye of little faith?
